Flintshire County Council is considering changing the way that education is being delivered in your area, by increasing the size of Drury Primary School to allow additional pupils into the school.


The Council is looking to increase the number of full time pupils at Drury Primary School from 124 to 180.


What are we doing?


The Council must follow certain processes when considering making significant changes to schools.

Your views are very important to us and will be given to the Council's Cabinet to make a decision to make changes to Drury Primary School.

Councillors will discuss your views, issues and implications of the options for Drury Primary School and then will decide what happens next.






Drury Primary School - Background

There are a number of primary schools and one high school in the surrounding area


- Drury Primary School is one of five English medium community school in the area
- It can currently accommodate up to 124 full time pupils
- Drury Primary School has consistently been over subscribed creating accommodation problems for the school
- Increased housing developments and pupils in the area has put pressure on demand for places at Drury Primary School



Drury Primary School – Additional Information







Why are we thinking about changing things?

- We would like all children and young people in the local area to attend their local school
- Demand for places at Drury Primary School has increased and we want to address this by building two additional classroom spaces for the school
- The existing school accommodation has significant suitability issues and we would like to address these by remodeling the existing school building





What are our options?

We have looked at a number of options for Drury Primary School

- Option 1 Do nothing this option has been rejected as this would not address the increased demand for pupil places at Drury Primary School and would mean some pupils in the area would potentially have to travel out of the area for their education ⋈
- Option 2 Do the minimum this option has been rejected as it would not address the ongoing condition and suitability issues at Drury Primary School
- Option 3 New Build for Drury Primary School there is not sufficient land on the existing school site to build a new school and no other land available in the area 図
- Option 3 Increase the size of Drury Primary School to provide two additional classrooms and remodel the existing school building to allow the school to accept more pupils – this is our preferred option



What are we Proposing?

We are proposing the following

- Increase the size of Drury Primary School from 124 to 180 full time pupils
- Build two additional classrooms onto the existing school building for Drury Primary School and remodel of the existing school building
- We are looking to increase the size of the school and complete the building works by September 2024

Formal Consultation	1 March 2022 to 11 April 2022
Cabinet consider the results of the consultation and determines whether to proceed with proposals	July 2022
Council publish statutory notice and enter into objection period	September 2022
Cabinet consider the objection report and determine whether or not to implement the proposals	November 2022
Decision notification letter is issued with outcome from Cabinet determination	December 2022
